### **Tell City Tops PAC in Academic Super Bowl**

The Pocket Athletic Conference hosted the Senior Division of the Academic Super Bowl on Tuesday, March 9, at Tell City High School. Tell City High School won the invitational with 107 points.

Participating high school students compete by answering questions in 6 academic disciplines: Science, Fine Arts, Social Studies, Math, English, and Interdisciplinary. The winning school is determined by the number of questions answered correctly. The statewide theme of this year's contest is "An American Generation 1964-1980"

Tell City came in first place in 3 disciplines: Math (18 points), Science (20 points), and Interdisciplinary (17 points). Heritage Hills finished first in Social Studies (16). North Posey took first in 2 disciplines: Fine Arts (19), and English (21).

The Academic Super Bowl competition is coordinated by the Indiana Association of School Principals with the lead sponsorship of Purdue University.
